Have you ever surprised yourself?

I’m frequently surprised by my daughters, whether its their wit, their silliness, or their beauty. They are a great gift and a surprise to my life, encouraging me to recognize the ways that God blesses me, “far more abundantly,” than I could even imagine.

Even though our circumstances and stories will be very different, we will be able to appreciate those surprises, celebrating the shared, “power that works within us.”
