Over the last 10 years, I've been learning to garden. Each year I learn a little more. But every year I'm amazed at the growth that happens this time of year. I've come to love this period when the power of life springs forth with vigor and urgency. It really is amazing. Little seeds that I planted back in early April, I nurtured into seedlings. I've planted those seedlings which have now grown nearly to their full height. Blossoms are emerging to be followed by the fruit.. Soon I'll be watching and waiting for the fruit to ripen. This amazing growth seems like a magical gift that God gives every summer, if I can only pay attention.
